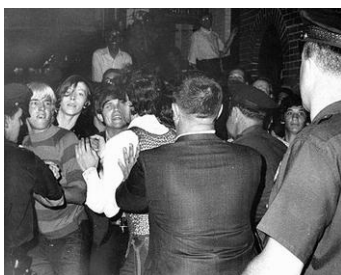

PLAN: The Confiscation of Japanese Americans' Property During WWII

Target Grade Level: 5-8

Students will engage in a social problem solving strategy, PLAN, in which they will think about multiple sides of a public problem, in this case the confiscation of Japanese American property during World War II, and explore ways to solve this problem to address social inequities. This strategy will help students develop the skills for effective citizenship, practice civic engagement skills and how to organize social action in their communities.



Respectful Debate: Stonewall Incident 1969

Target Grade Level: 9-12

In this lesson, students will weigh opposing perspectives on whether the event represented a riot or rebellion. Students will engage in a Respectful Debate, listen to both sides of the argument to regulate their emotions, build collective understanding and empathy for those that experienced and remember the event. Such skills are necessary for students to practice to support their efficacy in participating in and leading respectful debates for healthy civil discourse.

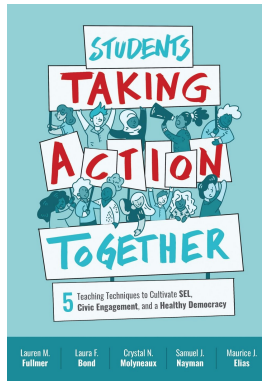
