## **Expanding Democracy**

In their Fall 2022 magazine issue, <u>Expanding Democracy</u>, Learning For Justice provides a collection of articles focused on expanding democracy through education with the goal of fostering an equitable society. These articles help educators to consider how to best support students and communities with a range of intersectional identities. We recommend the article, "<u>Community Organizing Uplifts Immigrant Students</u>," which examines how immigrant students and their families are empowering their communities to face obstacles and how educators can support this work.

### **Emotion Check-Ins 2.0**

Jeffery Young's EdSurge Article, "'How are You Feeling Today?' More Teachers Use Tech to Check Emotional Pulse of Students," shares a number of technology-based strategies for emotion check-ins. For example, Young shares how a Google Forms based check-in can provide students the space and privacy to share more of their emotional lives then they might in a typical check-in or conversation.



## Ready to Implement SEL Lessons

Greater Good in Education offers a <u>library</u> of socialemotional learning lesson plans. Each lesson plans includes a detailed outline of the lesson and an explanation on the research behind the skills taught in the lesson. Here are two lesson plans focused on helping students and educators turn a potentially negative situation into a learning experience.

- 1. <u>Finding Silver Linings</u>: This lesson plan teaches students or educators how to find the bright side of a negative experience.
- 2. Helping Students do Better Next Time: In this lesson plan, students consider how they could have differently handled difficult situations where they made a mistake, such as breaking a rule or saying the wrong thing to a peer. They then brainstorm additional actions they could take when faced with a future difficult moment.
