Developing Educator Connections

1. Michelle Hope's <u>article</u>, Prioritizing Connection, published in ACSD's October 2022 issue focuses on the importance of connections in the school building. Michelle also provides strategies to foster connection on a student-teacher level, on a school-wide level and in a professional development capacity.

2. With a focus on connection, Mark T. Greenberg's and Christa Turksma's article on <u>nurturing educator well-</u> <u>being</u> emphasizes the benefits for educators of developing relationships. The article examines how relationships create a sense of belonging for educators and links to 5 relationship skill mindfulness practices for building relationships.



Election Resources and Digital Literacy

On their <u>Future Voters Project</u> resource page, Learning for Justice provides resources for registering future voters and educating students about voting. We've chosen to highlight two resources from this comprehensive resource library:

1. <u>Teaching Digital Literacy this Election Season</u>: This resource library on digital literacy provides links to a number of articles, lesson plans and tools to teach digital literacy, including a video on "How to Balance Your Media Diet" and a lesson plan on "Evaluating Online Sources."

2. <u>Teach This: Texas Students Fight for Their Right to Vote</u>: This article provides a lesson structure for teaching students about how activists at Prairie View A&M University (PVAMU), a historically Black university, are confronting attempts at voter suppression. The article begins by providing resources to check student's knowledge and then includes a five-minute video about the PVAMU student activists with discussion questions. The article finishes with discussion questions for a broader classroom conversation to process voter suppression both at PVAMU and more broadly.
